Governance Structure

Executive Committee

The Executive Committee consists of eleven members, the Executive Officer, seven faculty, and three students. The Executive Officer, who chairs the Committee, is appointed by the President of The Graduate Center. The other faculty members are elected by the program's doctoral faculty. At least two faculty members, one in Linguistics and one in Literature, shall be Graduate Center appointees. The other five shall be elected at large by the doctoral faculty in Hispanic and Luso-Brazilian Literatures and Languages from the senior colleges, and at least one shall be elected from any college substantially participating in the program. There shall be three student members elected by the student body. All faculty members are elected for a term of three years; and student members are elected for one year.

Standing Committees

For all standing committees, except the Examination Committee and Elections Committee, the terms of office are three years for the faculty members and one year for student members.

Curriculum

The committee consists of the Executive Officer, two faculty members, and two elected student members.

Annual Examination

The committee consists of the Executive Officer and five faculty members appointed annually by the Executive Officer.

Admissions and Awards

The committee consists of the Executive Officer, two faculty members, and two elected student members.

Faculty Membership

The committee consists of the Executive Officer, two faculty members, and two elected student members.

Elections Committee

The committee consists of the Executive Officer, three faculty members, and three student members from the Executive Committee.

Doctoral Faculty shall meet twice each year. The Executive Committee shall meet with students at least once each semester.

New Governance Structure

Executive Committee

The Executive Committee consists of seven people, five faculty, and two student members. The Executive Officer, who chairs the Committee, is appointed by the President of the Graduate School. In addition, there is one faculty member from each of the senior colleges having professors on the doctoral faculty (presently four members) elected by the doctoral faculty. There are two student members, elected by the student body. All faculty members are elected for a term of three years. Student members are elected for one year.

Standing Committees

For all Standing Committees, the term of office are three years for the faculty members and one year for student members. The Standing Committees are sub-committees of the Executive Committee.

Curriculum and Examinations

The Committee consists of the Executive Officer, two faculty members, and one student member, appointed from the Executive Committee.

Admissions and Awards

The Committee consists of the Executive Officer, two faculty members and one student member appointed from the Executive Committee.

Faculty Membership

The Committee consists of the Executive Officer and two faculty members appointed from the Executive C mmittee.
